We continue to provide homeowners **FREE** recycling bins which allow all of us to work together to improve recycling efforts. I encourage everyone to use these recycling bins not only to make recycling easier but to also show our children the importance of separating and recycling our trash.

As a reminder, when you recycle you need to tie up or secure your cardboard and place bottles, cans, and glass into the recycling bins. In regards to bulk garbage, residents looking to dispose of old cloth furniture and mattresses should wrap these items in plastic. For refrigerators, televisions, microwaves, and other bulk items, please remember to book an appointment through our Department of Public Works by calling **973-365-5654**. I remind you that garbage should not be taken out before 5:00pm the night before your scheduled pick-up. Leaving garbage outside your home for days is also unfair to your neighbors and the garbage company employees and attracts pest and stray animals.

This year I remind you to consider adopting and maintaining clean storm drains in your neighborhood, as well as forming community neighborhood quality watch groups to go around your block and make sure it is clean, identify concerns with lighting, sidewalks, trees, and so on, and let us know. You can register your group at City Hall by my office at **(973) 365-5512**.

Please take note of all the important numbers we have provided in this year's calendar and help me spread the word about the importance of recycling and environmental awareness. Let us work together today to leave a better and cleaner tomorrow for generations to come.

SECURE YOUR HOME NETWORK

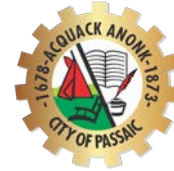
Never clearly identify your home network by using your name or apartment number. If your home network is named "John Smith's home" or "Apt 2B," then everyone knows which network to hack into. Always pick a generic, anonymous name and be sure to change all passwords that come with your network components. Those passwords are generally written in user manuals, which are posted online for all to see.

PROTECT YOUR CHILDREN ONLINE

Children present unique security risks when using a computer and often need advice, guidance, and protection. Talk to your children and let them know you can be approached with questions about behaviors or problems encountered on the computer. Teach your children how to safely use the computer and the Internet.

Tips to Reduce Security Risks to Your Child

- Keep your computer in a central and open location in your home, and be aware of other computers your child may be using.
- Discuss and set guidelines and rules for computer use with your child.
- Post these rules by the computer as a reminder.
- Use the Internet with your child. Familiarize yourself with your child's online activities, and maintain a dialogue with your child about what applications he or she is using.
- Implement parental control tools that are provided by some Internet Service Providers and available for purchase as separate software packages.
- Consider using software that allows you to monitor your child's email and web traffic.

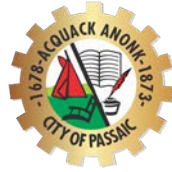
The Finance Department is responsible for all the city's fiscal operations including:

Tax Assessor

The assessor is responsible to the citizens of the taxing district for the fair assessment of all property in order for the tax burden to be distributed equitably.

Article VIII, Section 1, Par.1 of the Constitution states that property shall be assessed for taxation under general laws and by uniform rules. All real property assessed and taxed locally or by the State for allotment and payment to taxing districts shall be assessed according to the same standard of value, except as otherwise permitted herein and such real property shall be taxed at the general tax rate of the taxing district in which the property in which the property is situated for the use of such taxing district.

New Property Owners

Property ownership cannot be changed until a recorded deed is received by the Tax Assessor's Office.

The recorded Deed is sent to the Assessor from the Passaic County Registry Division. The estimated time to update ownership information from the date of sale is about 6-8 weeks.

Tax Collector

Property Taxes are due on the following dates:

- February 1st
- May 1st
- August 1st
- November 1st

The grace period for remitting payment of taxes is 10 days.* If you fail to pay within the grace period, taxes become delinquent and subject to interest back to the first day of that quarter.

*NJSA 54:4-66 Should the 10th fall on a weekend or a holiday, the grace period extends to the next business day.

To avoid interest charges, payment must be received in the Tax Collector's office no later than the last day of the grace day for the period. Postmark is NOT accepted.

2. You may also register online and create a profile to schedule re-occurring quarterly tax payments.

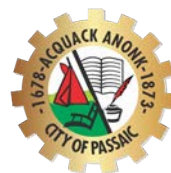

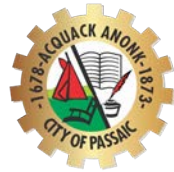
Types of permits that are issued by Engineering include (but not limited to):

- Excavating in the public right-of-way for sewers, water lines, or other digging activities.
- Road use permits for extra-large or heavy loads. Encroachment permits for temporary trash bins.

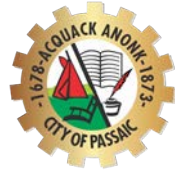
If you reside in the City of Passaic and own a cat or dog you must obtain a license. According to City Ordinance, you must obtain a license within ten (10) days after having acquired the pet. Any cat or dog which has attained the age of seven months or which possesses a set of permanent teeth.

You must provide proof that your pet has received a rabies immunization in order to obtain a license. The City of Passaic Health Division offers rabies clinics at least twice a year (one in the spring and one in the fall). These clinics are open to city residents. Notices of upcoming clinics are posted online.

In order to obtain a license you must visit the Passaic City Clerk's Office. The office is located on the first floor of City Hall at 330 Passaic Street, Passaic, New Jersey.

UEZ, Planning, Zoning & Redevelopment

Urban Enterprise Zone (UEZ)

The UEZ provides qualified businesses in designated zones certain state tax benefits. The program also provides a revenue source for the cities containing UEZs. The revenues can be used by the cities for a variety of locally initiated programs to further help the UEZ businesses. Passaic's UEZ boundary encompasses approximately 95% of all businesses within the city, It includes all the industrial areas and all the retail corridors.

What are the benefits of becoming a certified business in the Urban Enterprise Zone (UEZ)?

- **Access to UEZ Programs** - You have access to various programs and services offered by the Passaic Enterprise Zone Development Corporation such as loans to enhance your business and free graffiti removal.
- **Reduce Sales Tax** - Subject to certain restrictions, UEZ businesses charge their customers half the state tax of 6.625%
- **Free Tax Purchases** - On certain items such as capital equipment, facility expansion and upgrades.

Planning Board

The Planning Board is responsible for preparing, amending and adopting the municipal Master Plan. The Master Plan is a comprehensive, long-range plan intended to guide the growth and development of the city and consists of land use, recreation, housing, recycling, traffic and conservation elements.

The Planning Board oversees minor sub divisions and minor site plans, major site plans as well as preliminary major sub divisions.

The Planning Board reviews and reports to the city council on any municipal zoning ordinances or revisions/amendments to existing ordinances before its adoption.

Zoning Board

The primary responsibility of the Zoning Board of Adjustment, sometimes called the Zoning Board, is to hear and vote on requests for variances or exceptions to our zoning ordinance. Additionally, the Zoning Board may review some site plan applications for approval or denial. Other powers of the Board include hearing and deciding on appeal applications of decisions made by an administrative officer, such as the Zoning Officer or Planner; and to interpret the zoning map or zoning ordinance.

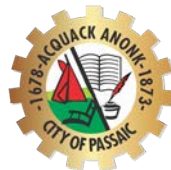
The Zoning Board is a quasi-judicial body. It functions similar to, but not as strictly as a court of law, and makes binding legal decisions. The Municipal Land Use Law ("MLUL"), 40:55D; sets forth the statutory law guiding the Zoning Board.

Recycling

NJ has banned Plastic Carryout Bags & Polystyrene Foam in Stores, Grocery Stores & Food Service Businesses

New Jersey retail stores, grocery stores and food service businesses may not provide or sell single-use plastic carryout bags and polystyrene foam food service products. Single-use paper carryout bags are allowed to be provided or sold, except by grocery stores equal to or larger than 2500 square feet, which may only provide or sell reusable carryout bags.



The City of Passaic launched Recycle Coach™, a mobile and web app that contains trash and recycling schedules tailored to individual addresses. On the free mobile app, residents can view/export schedules and set up automatic reminders right on their smartphones.

It's important to note that the city's collection schedules are not changing, nor can residents schedule a time for trash and recycling collection. The Recycle Coach™ app is designed to make it easier for residents to remember when to place trash and recycling on the curb for pickup.

The Recycle Coach™ app is free to download and it is available from the App Store and Google Play.

Parking Authority

The duties of the authority are to construct, improve, maintain and operate off-street parking facilities, to promote traffic improvements and the free flow of traffic through the city streets and to improve conditions affecting public safety and welfare.

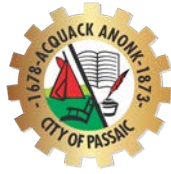

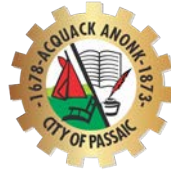

The Passaic Fire Department provides firefighting and other services necessary to safeguard lives and property. Services include water recovery, rescue services and hazardous material responses.

The Passaic Fire Department would like to share the following **fire safety reminders**:

- Fifty percent of apartment fires and one-quarter of the fires in private homes start in the kitchen.
- Most home cooking fires involve the stovetop portion of the range. One-third of these fires result from unattended cooking.
- The majority of fires and burns can be prevented during food preparation by taking precautions.

Follow these precautions when preparing the kitchen and cooking, especially for the Sabbath and holiday meals, when there is increased activity in the kitchen:

Fire Prevention Tips

- Stay in the kitchen – do not leave cooking food unattended.
- Wear tighter or snug-fitting sleeves. (Loose sleeves are more likely to catch fire or get caught on pot handles.)
- Take extra precautions when handling boiling water.
- Cook at indicated temperature settings, rather than higher settings.
- Do not become distracted by attending to children, or answering phone calls or doorbells.
- Create a “kid-free zone” of at least three feet around you stove.
- Keep area clear of towels, papers, or anything else that can burn.
- Turn pot handles inward, facing the wall, to prevent burns caused by overturning or spills.
- Have a pot lid or container of baking soda handy to smother a pan fire.
DO NOT USE WATER.
- Treat burns immediately with cool running water and seek medical attention.

Fire Hazard Tips & Information

Develop a Fire Escape Plan:

Can your family survive a fire in the home?

Protect your family by planning and practicing a home fire escape plan. Know two ways out from each room and agree on a meeting place outside so that you will know everyone is out safely.

Make Sure Smoke/Carbon Monoxide Alarms Work:

- Twice a year when you change your clocks.
- Check/change your smoke detector and carbon monoxide detector batteries.
- Practice your home fire escape plan.

Fire Safety

If there is a Fire:

- DO NOT try to fight the fire yourself.
- Get out and stay out. DO NOT try to gather personal possessions.
- CLOSE THE DOOR ON YOUR WAY OUT.
- If smoke is present, exit as low to the ground as possible and keep your mouth covered.
- Call 9-1-1 once you reach a safe location.
- If any part of your clothing catches fire, DO NOT run or try to put the fire out with your hands.
- Cover your face with your hands, drop to the ground and roll over and over again.



Junior Fire Academy

The Passaic Junior Fire Academy is a week-long intensive program for Passaic youth ages 9-15. This highly successful program was held for the first time in 2021. The Jr. Firefighters had a chance to learn about local fire, rescue, and emergency medical services response in a safe, controlled, educational, and fun way, which provided them with valuable life skills such as teamwork, leadership, responsibility, and commitment.

Municipal Court

City of Passaic Jurisdiction

It is through the Municipal Courts that most citizens in the State come into contact with the judicial system, either as a defendant, a victim, or witness. Since most citizens will never appear before another court, it is from their experience in the Municipal Courts that most people base their conclusions about the quality of justice in New Jersey.

The Municipal Courts in New Jersey are considered courts of limited jurisdiction, having responsibility for motor vehicle and parking tickets, minor criminal-type offenses (for example, simple assault and bad checks), municipal ordinance offenses (such as dog barking or building code violations) and other offenses, such as fish and gaming violations.

A Municipal Court usually has jurisdiction only over cases that occur within the boundaries of its municipality. Many serious criminal cases, such as a robbery, auto theft, or assault, start out as complaints filed in the Municipal Court but those cases are transferred to the Superior Court located at the county courthouse.

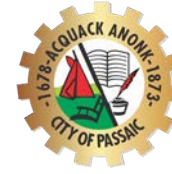
Municipal Court Sessions

Passaic Municipal Court Sessions are virtual and in person. If an individual wishes to attend court in person, please get in touch with the court on behalf of your request. The option is voluntary on payable offenses but mandatory for other court matters. Please use the New Jersey Courts webpage to learn how to request an interpreter, plead guilty/nonguilty, and request an attorney. The E courts and electronic filings can handle most parking tickets. 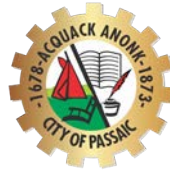

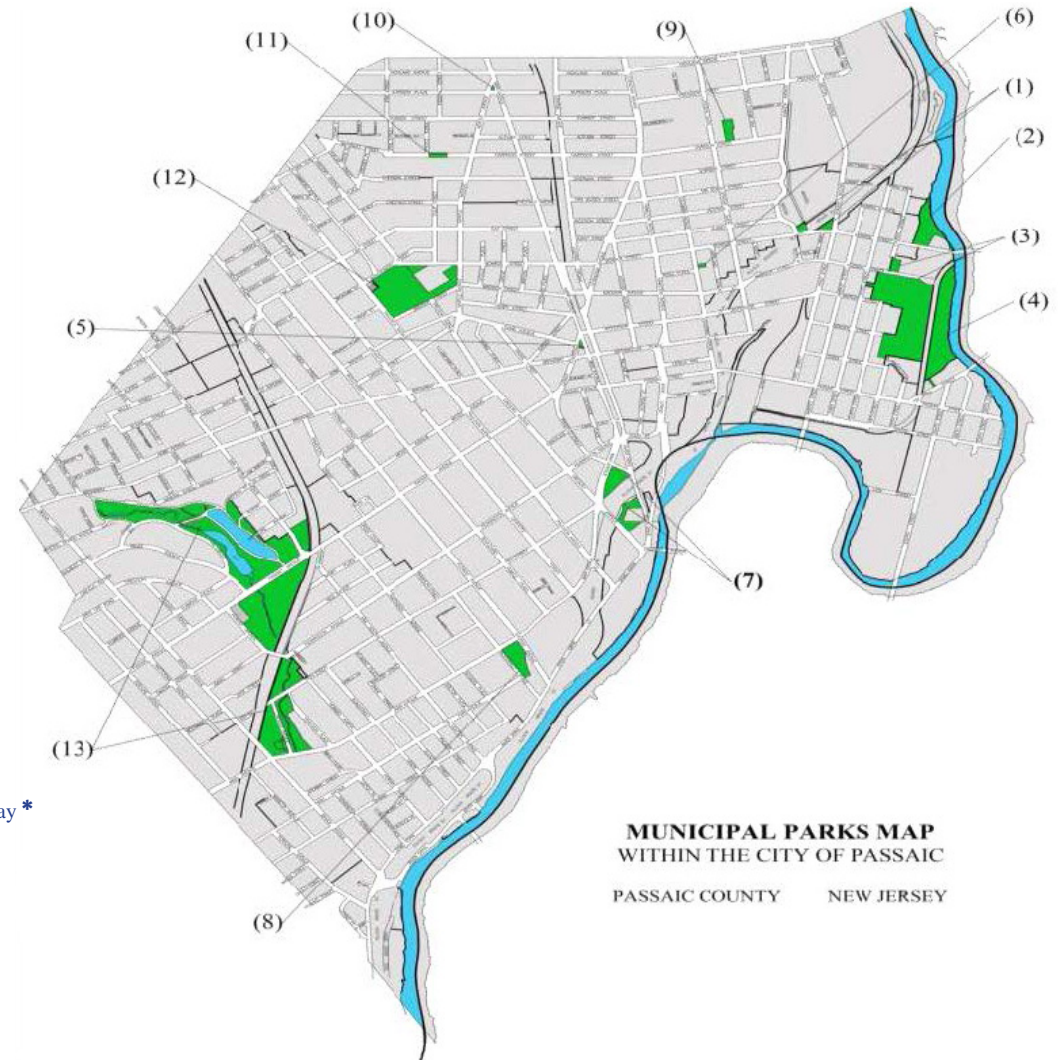
Public Parks

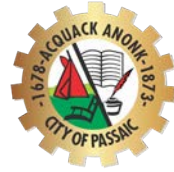

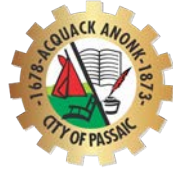

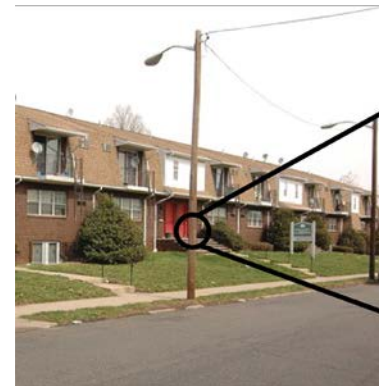
